

# Museum show displays county artists' talents

Jane French, the exhibitions organiser for the LSA said: 'Bryan, a member of LSA and a former president, has for inclusion in the exhibition generously loaned us his sketches for the Attenborough portrait. They are the focal point of the show and on public view for the first time. This is our largest and widest ranging exhibition yet, with more than 230 beautiful and original items on show'.

A bronze sculpture by Royal British Society of Sculpture Fellow John Sydney Carter is also on display – along with the winning entries of the LSA student Award.

This year's winners are De Monfort University graduate Tiffany Tangen and Loughborough University student Samson Tudor. Admission is free to the exhibition which is sponsored by financial investment specialist Charles Stanley and runs until December 3. It is open 10am to 5pm Monday to Saturday and 11am to 5pm on Sundays.
